69th Strongsville Homecoming has Rides, Food, and Fun

The 69th annual Homecoming, sponsored by the Strongsville Chamber of Commerce, gets underway on Wednesday, July 20 and continues through Saturday. July 23 on the city Commons, right in the heart of the community.

Following tradition, the festivities will be kicked off by the "Spirit of Strongsville" Homecoming parade, sponsored by Fifth Third Bank and the Strongsville Chamber of Commerce.

The parade will step off at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday from Progress Drive and Pearl and then proceed south toward the Commons. All parade vehicles and walkers will turn east on Westwood Drive, proceeding to the area around the Recreation Center. Parents will be able to meet children in that area following the parade.

A free concert featuring the popular show band Breakfast Club will begin at approximately 8:30 p.m. on the stage located at the southwest corner of the Commons.

A major improvement will be evident this year. The seating area for the entertainment will be covered with a huge tent. "Last summer we experienced three nights of rain. We've added this covered area to keep our audience dry and comfortable, rain or shine," commented Tom Burichin, Homecoming General Chairperson.

Another addition this year will be Northeast Ohio's Largest 50 - 50 Raffle. Tickets will be sold for the four days of Homecoming. The total will be split in a drawing to be held at 12:00 midnight on Saturday. Winner need not be present.
